Increase Food Sales with Menu Boards

- 1. Grab student attention with luscious food pictures that make them point and say "I want that!"

Growing your dining program with menu boards

A quick illustration of how luscious, enticing food pictures on menu boards grow revenue in your dining program:

Years ago, fast food restaurants had large menu boards with many choices, but few pictures of their food items. When the cashier asked customers what they wanted, most would take a long time deciding. This slowed down the amount of customers through the serving line, and took the "fast" out of fast food.

One day, someone had the idea to put up pictures of the different items in the hope that it would enable customers to make selections quicker.

This one idea — *using enticing food pictures* — speeds the selection process and gets customers through the line quicker.

Notice how people order the next time you are in a fast food restaurant. Also, remember your visit to a favorite restaurant — if you chose your selection based on how the picture of your entrée looked on the menu.



And if you ask your server, they will tell you that the picture is the main reason why people select a particular dessert *Believe me, I speak from personal experience in this. I just can't resist a tempting dessert picture!*

6 little known techniques using menu boards to increase á la carte sales

- 1. Always use a luscious food picture of your menu items. You want to create a situation where kids point at the picture and say, "I want that!"
- 2. Never put too many serving size options on the board - use regular and large – to speed their choice.
- 3. List all your a la carte items in order of popularity, and group them by category to make selection easier (for instance, keep all drinks together and all desserts together).
- 4. Use colored backup strips to highlight your most popular offering, or to denote a special food selection
- 5. Use double high headers with colored strip and white letters to focus students' eyes on your food groups.
- 6. Use the school cafeteria nickname in a large header strip to personalize the cafeteria.
- 7. BONUS TIP #7 -Remember idea #1-**ALWAYS** use delicious looking food pictures. This idea alone will raise your sales 7-10%.



Our artists created a colorful vivid graphic which clearly directs the students to the foods they want — and provide a uniform look for the new food courts in all schools.


We personalize each school's menu board by using different color trim around the board with each school's colors.

Now this is a restaurant look!










Menu Boards – Illuminated :: Kissimmee, FL



Elementary Nutrition Education Menu Boards


The menu item strips are colors to show the main food components and has dots to highlight the secondary components. — For instance, a hamburger woud have a red color (for meat) with a brown dot (for the bread bun).

There is no simpler way to show students the relationship between the food they are having each day, and information they must know about the food groups to have a healthy diet.

There are more uses for this multifunction menu board:


- 1. Place it on the optional movable stand, and take it into the classroom for nutrition education.
- 2. Useful as English language learning tool for California Proposition 227 English language education for non-english speakers
 - What an easy way to teach non-english speaking students the rudiments of English (weren't food items the second thing you learned when preparing for a trip to a foreign culture? After learning how to find the bathroom, of course!)!

3. Emphasize the special name for your dining room to create student spirit.



- 4. Teach Foods-of –other-Cultures. We can provide the pre-printed menu strips in Spanish, French, Italian, and German.
- 5. Teach your students early on that school food is not boring! When they see the variety of food items you offer on a daily basis – you have a better chance of keeping them in the school food program as they grow up.

Remember – these young students see menu boards every time they go into a fast food restaurant.


